Safeguarding (Mrs Beale)

We often talk about the ages that children should be able to access apps. Do you know that there has been an 82% rise in online grooming crimes against children in the last 5 years.

The statistics are stark

- 150 different apps, games and websites were used to groom children
- 26% of online grooming offences against children took place on Snapchat.
 - 47% of online grooming offences took place on Meta-owned products such as Facebook, Instagram and Whatsapp.
