Year two



This week, Year 2 welcomed their parents into school to showcase the artistic skills they've been developing this half term. The children used sketching pencils to draw scenes of Erith, choosing either a past or present view of the town. They then explored shading techniques and experimented with different types of lines using charcoal, creating some truly impressive artwork.

This week in Year 3, we have been developing our final pieces of artwork, inspired by the plans we created last week. Our focus has been on recreating cave drawings and exploring the natural colours that people in the past might have used. The children particularly enjoyed experimenting with texture to create a realistic, uneven surface that represents the walls of a cave.

Year 4 have enjoyed collaborating lots these last few days. In reading, the children used their skimming and scanning skills to retrieve information from the text 'This Morning I Met A Whale' by Michael Morpurgo. They then drew the information they gathered. The children have also been learning adding and subtracting using written methods in maths. In one of our Teach Active lessons, they worked in pairs and took it in turn to travel round the planets by solving the calculations.



Year Five



This week, Year 5 have been using manipulatives to create arrays and explore patterns in numbers. This hands-on approach helped them identify prime numbers and understand why some numbers can only be made into one array. A fantastic way to make maths visual and meaningful!

This week, Year 6 had the honour of welcoming our parents to visit our Term 1 Learning Gallery. Pupils proudly showcased their newspaper articles and shared their impressive learning journey in mathematics, particularly their work on numbers. They also presented their exciting history learning, exploring and debating the question: "Is it appropriate to celebrate lawbreakers?"
