This week in Reception we have been discussing the different celebrations that have taken place over the past couple of weeks. We have explored printing using different resources such as potato printing to make poppies for Remembrance Day and we have used cotton buds to create our own fireworks to celebrate Bonfire night.

In Year 1 we have been looking at vocabulary, we have been using our dictionaries and iPads to search for words and find out what their meanings are. This is great for using various resources to problem solve, and learn new words at the same time.







This week in English, year 2 have been looking at prepositions within our story 'Islandborn'. We have been continuing to focus on descriptive writing using a range of adjectives and including prepositions to describe where something is.

In Year 3 we have been learning to vary the length of our sentences to create action writing. This week we have looked at clipped sentences for impact and longer sentences for description. We worked with a partner to create a paragraph to describe a bull fight using a mix of long and short sentences. Then we added some sentences of our own to this paragraph. Next we will use what we have learnt to create our own action writing. I am sure you will agree that these paragraphs really capture the interest of the reader.









This week, Year 4 went on a trip to the library. They listened to a story as a class, and then they had the opportunity to look at the books and decided which one they would like to check out. They've each got a new reading book that they've chosen for themselves!





In Year 5 this week, we explored the feelings the characters in our core text Hidden Figures may have had to experience. We explored key vocabularies, such as discrimination and segregation, and they also had the chance to experience how the characters in the book felt through role-play. This allowed the children to step into the shoes of the characters and gain a deeper appreciation for the challenges they faced, particularly in the context of discrimination and segregation during that period. This helped them have a better understanding of societal changes over time.

This week, year 6 have continued on their coding journey, by exploring the online programme, Scratch. This week, the children moved their 'sprite' avatars and looked at coding repeating movements. Well done Year 6.
