We learned about the different types of bullying (physical, verbal, cyber and social), and got to do some brilliant role play. The children were able to act as very realistic teachers and adults!





This week, Year 4 have started to plan their suspense story, using our model text to support as well as a box up grid. We have looked at techniques to help build suspense through using short sentences, use of ellipses and showing how the character responds to a situation. Some of our stories are set in either a creepy mansion, a dark dense forest or an eerie damp cave.





This week Year 5 have had such a varied week full of workshops and visits! They had a visit from PC Ryan to talk about Stranger Danger, and then they had a exciting anti-bullying workshop, creating an antibullying rap! In maths, they have been exploring Prime Numbers, and in English they have been exploring newspapers. Great work!

As part of Anti-Bullying Week, we had Marilen from Perform come in and run a drama session with us. The class discussed what to do in different scenarios where there were different bullying issues and then in small groups, acted out different scenes...thinking of the people who would be involved. Once they had performed their piece, the rest of the class had to identify the characters being played, the bully, the bystander, the safe adult etc. The class had fun and had good discussions through the session.
