SAFEGUARDING

Thirteen leading health organisations in the UK, including the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health (RCPCH), have written an open letter to the Government asking for a change in the law to better protect children. They are calling for the removal of the 'reasonable punishment' defence, which currently allows parents to use physical discipline in certain situations. The letter explains that this law gives children less protection from being hurt than adults and highlights the serious harm physical punishment can cause. Research shows that children who are physically punished are more likely to suffer from poor mental health and face a higher risk of serious abuse. The organisations point out that, unlike children in Scotland and Wales, children in England do not yet have the same level of legal protection.
