Safeguarding

A Safety Warning: Dangerous TikTok "Choking" Challenge called Tap Out.

We want to make parents and carers aware of a dangerous trend circulating on social media platforms such as TikTok. The challenge involves young people placing each other in a chokehold, applying pressure to the neck until the person "taps out." While videos often show participants laughing and walking away unharmed, this activity is extremely dangerous and can cause serious injury, brain damage, or even death due to lack of oxygen.

Please speak to your children about the dangers of this challenge and remind them never to take part or encourage others to do so. We also encourage parents to be vigilant, monitor social media activity, and report any concerns to the school or relevant authorities.
