On Monday, Year 6 visited the Imperial War Museum as part of their topic this term. The children had the opportunity to explore powerful exhibitions and artefacts linked to key moments in history, helping them to deepen their understanding of the past. It was a valuable visit which brought their classroom learning to life.

On Tuesday, Nursery enjoyed a very sweet visit to the local library. The children loved exploring the books, listening to stories and learning how a library works. It was wonderful to see their excitement and curiosity, and we hope it helped to inspire a love of reading from an early age.

In addition, we have been marking Children's Mental Health Week, with classes exploring a range of topics focused on wellbeing, resilience and emotional awareness. On Thursday, Year 5 visited the Science Museum, linked to their learning this term. Year 2 enjoyed an exciting trip to the Tower of London to complete their topic on castles. The visit brought their learning to life as they explored one of the most famous historic landmarks in the country. During their visit, the children were thrilled to see the magnificent Crown Jewels and learn about their importance in British history. They also took part in a special workshop where they trained to become knights! The children practised how to bow correctly and learned about the important role of serving the King and Queen.

Year 3 used what we learned in science class to create and observe our own simulated volcanic eruption, helping us better understand how real volcanoes work. By combining hands-on experimentation with our knowledge of chemical reactions, we were able to see how pressure builds up and causes an eruption—just like in nature!

Year 4 have been using their iPad to consolidate their learning on finding the perimeter of rectangles. The children loved this practical lesson where they found the length of two sides, and then used a range of calculations such as repeated addition or adding and multiplying by 2 to find the perimeter.

Safeguarding

Safer Internet Day

Talk with your child about responsible use of their games console

Discuss what is okay and not okay to use it for and look at the possible risks. Tell your child what they should do if something goes wrong while using it. This could be to turn off the screen and tell an adult.

Think about the location of the games console

Will it be in a shared family space or in a bedroom?

Think about: setting time limits; reminding your child about the risks of communicating online with people that they do not know; and encouraging them to come to you with any worries.

Explore parental controls

Take a look at the controls available both on the games console itself and on your home Wi-Fi. Talk these through with your child too. Parental controls are a helpful tool, but an open conversation with your child is the most important thing.
