Early Years



This week in EYFS we've been exploring colours discovering new shades, mixing paints, and having lots of creative fun!

The children have loved experimenting and seeing how colours change when we mix them together.

This week, Year 2 have been busy developing their oracy skills through rich discussion and storytelling. Using our core text Katie in London, the children explored how different characters feel at key moments throughout the story. They worked together to express their ideas clearly, listen carefully to others, and build on each other's thoughts.

This week, Year 3 have been developing their oracy and debating skills in Reading through an activity called "Conscious Ally," inspired by our core text The Iron Man. The class was split into two teams — one for the townspeople building a trap and one against it. Working together, each group prepared thoughtful responses to support their side of the argument. The activity provided a fantastic opportunity to strengthen a wide range of skills, including teamwork, collaboration, speaking, and structured debate. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring different viewpoints and crafting persuasive arguments.

Year 4 are really enjoying learning some more cords and songs on the ukuleles. They can recap things from last year and are excelling at learning some more complicated music.



Year Five



This week, in Year 5, in science, the children created a salt solution as part of their work on reversible and irreversible changes. They set up a fair test and carefully controlled all variables, including ensuring that each solution was placed under the same conditions for the week. Over the coming days, the children will observe how the salt begins to crystallise, recording the changes they notice and discussing what this tells them about evaporation and particle behaviour.

This week in Year 6 we have been using our prior learning to help us identify the properties of materials. We tested each material for magnetism, permeability, transparency and flexibility. This supported us and our discussions when we were sorting materials into what they are best used for.

#### A For Parents and Carers

If collecting your child, please park safely and avoid stopping in areas that reduce visibility for others.

Encourage punctual pick-ups to reduce children waiting alone in the dark.
