Safeguarding (Mrs Beale)

Do you Know which toys/ devices contain button batteries? Are you aware of the potential danger?

Button batteries react with saliva to create caustic soda - the chemical often used to unblock drains. If a child swallows a button battery and it gets stuck in their food pipe (oesophagus), it can burn a hole and cause internal bleeding, or even death. Larger lithium 'coin cell' batteries (about the size of a five pence piece) are the most dangerous, but it is best to keep all button batteries out of a child's reach. Smaller batteries can be inserted into places such as ears and noses, causing serious injuries if undetected.
