In Catkin class this we have been very busy using what we have learnt during our daily phonics to write CVC words. We have also been practicing holding our pens correctly and practicing our letter formation. Just look how amazing our work is!

Year 1 have been learning about Christianity this week. The children went to our local church "Our Lady of Angels", where Brother Mathhew was very kind and showed us around the beautiful church. The children discovered what you would find in a church and how Christian's worship god. They also discovered why you would find stain glass windows, and how they tell a story through pictures.





As part of RE week, children in year 2 have been learning about Judaism. Children have been comparing what they already know about Christianity and what they have learnt about Judaism. They have looked at similarities and difference and found out that even though we all believe different things, we can all still be friends.

This week in Year 3, we have been consolidating our RE learning by thinking and talking about what different people believe about God. We have considered the similarities and differences between the beliefs and practices of Islam, Hinduism and Christianity, and how different faiths are represented through artistic expression. Finally, we have looked at how we can all appreciate and respect the various belief systems that exist in our diverse community and beyond.









This week Year 4 are learning about the core beliefs of Hinduism. We have focused on the different gods and goddess and what they are responsible for. We also learnt how Hindus show that they care for one another and the aims of Purusharthas.

This week the children have been finishing their tudor house art in preparation for their beautiful publishing wall. They have been comparing calculations and doing the inverse in maths using counters to help them, as well as practising their timestables. The children have been learning about christianity in R.E, and comparing it to different religions. They have also made connections to other areas of their learning such as History during this. They have created a presentation which they will share with their peers at the end of the week.







Recently in Elder class, we have been trialling a new piece of software to help us with our reading. The software is able to track how we read and answer questions. It takes this information and then makes the reading a bit easier or a bit harder, until it gets it just right. Later we will be able to score "combos" and earn points to use as we read more. We have enjoyed using it to practice our reading and a lot of us have been scoring over 80%, if not 100% as we have been finding our level.
