Dear Parents/Carers,

We hope you have all had a good week.

This week we launched a month dedicated to Black History. We spoke to the children about this being our shared history and spoke about prominent black figures in the UK and beyond. We are currently re writing our curriculum so that black history runs through it; we will share this with our community once it has been written.

On Monday, we had a visit from Julie Carson, the Director of Education from our Trust. This was the first time she had visited this term and here is some of her feedback:

It was a pleasure to walk round NHP this morning, with tangible improvements across the school.

The classrooms felt purposeful, and every class was calm and settled with clear expectations in place. This is a significant improvement from previous visits.

We are seeing the improvements day by day and it has been good to have external validation for all the hard work the team are putting into the school; ensuring the children have a calm environment to achieve their potential. As with all school improvement journeys, we still have a way to go, but we are definitely going in the right direction.

We had our first parent forum on Tuesday and although there were only a few parents who came along, it was an opportunity to talk about the school, our thoughts, and the journey of school improvement. I will send out a separate letter with the points we discussed and a date for the next meeting.

We had some classes visit the library and they had a lively time looking through and choosing books.

The weather is due to be lovely this weekend, so enjoy it as a family and we look forward to seeing you all on Monday.

In Saplings class we have been using our knowledge of phonemes (sounds) to practise writing CVC words and matching the picture cards to words.

This week in year 1 we have been looking at evergreen and deciduous trees in science. We now know that the tress lose their leaves in Autumn, to prepare for the winter.





This week Year 2 have enjoyed using manipulatives to review concepts previously taught. This has helped us to secure our understanding and demonstrate our learning in a concrete way. During one lesson, we worked in partners to practise representing numbers to 100, using base 10. We worked together to partition the number into tens and ones and described our representations using our mathematical vocabulary.

Year 3 have been having fun in their Design and Technology lessons, experimenting with different levers and linkages. They have worked out that different linkages create different movements. The children are looking forward to using these simple mechanisms when they re-create a page from our model text 'The Stone Age Boy.'











This week, in writing, Year 4 have been learning how to plan and create a journey tale.

After watching a short animation, we worked in groups to plan and create our own stories, using the different writing techniques that we have learnt since the start of term.

Our stories have come out fantastically and have been beautifully displayed on our classroom publishing walls, something for us to look at and be proud of.

This week Year 5 have been exploring a range of vocabulary to use for emotions, acting them out using show not tell. They wrote a description of an emotion and asked their partner to guess what the emotion was showing - the vocabulary they selected was excellent and shown in their writing. In maths, they have rounded up their place value topic with some place value board games, so their teacher could identify their strengths and areas to practise.







In Oak class the children worked together to test varying the voltage in a circuit. One group took two photos with an i-pad to record how their circuit made with four cells (6V) made a bulb shine brighter than their circuit with one cell (1.5V). The children wrote a generalised statement about their learning
