This week in reception we have enjoyed learning outside by making Father Christmas' sleigh and flying to the North Pole and writing letters to him in our outdoor writing area.

This week Year 1 explored the high street. We had a great time buying items from our local shops and exploring our high street. The children also wrote thank you letters to Brother Matthew and the librarians to say thank you for letting us visit.







This week in science, year 2 have been exploring micro-habitats. We went to forest school to see what micro-habitats we could kind. We then went back to class and designed a micro-habitat for an insect of our choosing using the Showbie app.

It's been another very busy week in Year 3, especially as we prepare for our Christmas Carol concert next week alongside all our usual lessons. It was our last swimming lesson before Christmas, and we got to play some fun games at the pool - and we even practised the Makaton signing of "We Wish You a Merry Christmas" in the water for the swimming coaches! We've been enjoying our Maths lessons in particular, with children getting to try out "speaking like an expert", as well as finishing our Mola art, inspired by the intricate designs of the indigenous Guna people from Panama. Phew!







Year 4 had a fantastic trip to the Science Museum this week. They explored how electricity how everyday jobs in the home, e.g. doing the laundry, heating of our homes and cleaning of the home, have been transformed by the use of electrical appliances.

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This week in Year 5, we have been writing drafts of our newsletter reports about the history made from our core text 'Hidden Figures'. The children have been able to research and explore why the 'Hidden Figures' are called hidden figures and the changes they have made possible. Alongside this, they have been working on their cosmic artwork for their publishing display, which all will be revealed soon).

Arbor We use Arbor to communicate important notices and information with parents. You should have set up your account when your child joined the school. If you are unable to access the Arbor app, please speak to the front office.

#### Safeguarding (Mrs Beale)

All pedestrians are more at risk in the dark or bad weather when visibility is poor. Road collisions often happen when road users cannot see each other until it is too late

We can help other road users to see us by wearing the right clothes and accessories. Fluorescent colours can be seen best during daytime and at dusk, they don't show up at night. Fluorescent materials are usually, yellow, orange or lime green – the majority, including the PSNI, wear yellow.

Reflective materials are best at night - reflecting the light from car and motorbike headlights. They work in the same way as the cat's eyes that mark traffic lanes.

Reflective materials are available as stickers, tapes and tags which can be easily attached to clothes and other items.

For best all round protection wear clothes or safety accessories that combine fluorescent colours with reflective material.
