Our topic this term is: The Greeks of Olympia.



In English, we will be exploring Greek myths and using these to write our own myth. We will also be creating an alternative ending to a Greek myth and creating our own Greek mythical creature.

In Maths, we will start to explore fractions, converting between improper fractions to mixed numbers and equivalent fractions. We will also learn about tenths and how they are represented as decimals.

In Science, we will explore the topic of sounds with a focus on how sounds are made through vibrations, how sound travels, as well as the difference between pitch and volume of a sound.

In History, we will be comparing Ancient and Modern Day Greece. We will be exploring the impact of Ancient Greece on life today especially on democracy, architecture, art, and culture.

In Computing, we will explore the importance of sequence within an algorithm. We will use OSMO to support our coding practice.

In Art, we will be studying the work of artist Lucis Rie and sketch Greek designs. By the end of the term, we will have created a Greek vase using modroc. In Personal development, we will understand what it means to cultivate independence through target setting and discussing the relationship between money and work.

In Music, the children will be singing a variety of song styles, taught against a backdrop of the Heroes of Troy – the story of the Trojan war. The focus will cover the following: dynamics, pitch accuracy, tone production, pulse and rhythm, phrase structure, expressive techniques, improve concentration/memory, diction, and two-part singing.
