Our topic for this term is Our World!



In English, we will be discovering the difference between fiction and non-fiction texts. The children will have the opportunity to create a non-fiction text incorporating our knowledge from science. They will also produce a fiction piece of writing; creating a 'Wish Tale' about friendship.

In Maths, the children will be looking at subtraction and addition, building on their knowledge from last term. By the end of the Autumn 2, they will be proficient in using the Part-Whole model and be able to explain what number bonds are, using manipulatives and number sentences.

In Science, we will be looking at the animal kingdom and how to classify different animals. The children will explore and discover how animals have adapted to their climate environments. They will also discover the parts of the human body and how humans are classified as mammals.

In Geography, we will be expanding our global knowledge of where in the world we live. Focussing on continents, oceans and seas, the children will have an overview of how the weather is different around the world, linking into science and seasonal changes.

In Computing, the children will explore the application notes. They will look at how it works, and attempt to apply this to their learning.

In Art, the children will learn about Paul Klee, focusing on his artwork around different animals.

In Music, we will continue investigating the importance of a pulse in music and creating rymthm and beat.

In Personal Development, we will be looking at kindness and how it translates to our community. Children will learn about looking after our family and others. This will support our school values and the children's expectations within school and home.

In our Wider Curriculum, we will be looking at the global overview, linking science and geography. We will discuss seasonal change, why we have seasonal changes and how animals have adapted to these climates.
