Our topic this term is Helping Our Community



In English, we are going to be using our core text 'Up' to describe using noun phrases and expanded noun phrase. We will be retelling the story using sequential language and will be creating our own adventure story.

In Maths this term, we will be exploring place value within 100, partitioning within 100 and writing numbers in words from 1 to 100. We will be looking at estimating, comparing, and ordering numbers. We will also consolidate our counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

In Science, we will be learning about the life cycles of animals and humans. We will be comparing the stages of human development and exploring what humans and animals need to survive by looking at the health food pyramid. As well as the effects of exercise on the body.

In History, we will be exploring our local area and how it has changed over time. We will be looking at key figures who have helped to develop Northumberland Heath. We will also be using maps to identify Northumberland Heath within Bexley, London, England and the world.

In Computing, we will learn about the importance of staying safe online and what e-safety means.

In D T, we will be looking at healthy eating and different ways of preparing different foods, such as cutting, slicing and grating.

In Music, we will begin to learn about South African music through the song 'Hands, Feet, Heart'.

In Personal Development, we will identify the importance of friends, explaining the importance of honesty, how to listen to our friends when they are speaking and expressing opinions, as well as exploring what bullying is. This will all be explored through the theme of respect.

In our wider curriculum, we will be exploring our local area - how we are part of the community and what we can do to help support our local community, through food banks, volunteering, and local projects.
